Community Clinic to Celebrate Opening of Women’s Health Services in Siloam Springs with Ribbon Cutting on May 15

Increasing access to women’s health, including prenatal, hospital delivery, and women’s health services to Siloam Springs and the surrounding area

SILOAM SPRINGS, Ark. — Community Clinic will host a ribbon cutting ceremony on Friday, May 15 to celebrate the expansion of women’s health services at its Progress Avenue location in Siloam Springs—marking a significant step forward in improving access to care for women in the region.

Community Clinic Pediatrics & Women’s Health—formerly known as Sager Creek Pediatrics & Family Care—has long been a trusted location for care in the community. Today, it plays a critical role in expanding access to comprehensive women’s health services in Siloam Springs and surrounding areas. The clinic will provide a full range of women’s health services, including annual checkups, birth control and family planning, menopause and hormone support, and care during pregnancy.

Responding to a Statewide Call to Action

In response to Arkansas Governor Sarah Huckabee Sanders’ 2024 maternal health call to action and Executive Order 24–03, Community Clinic moved to strengthen and expand women’s health services in Siloam Springs, including prenatal care, supporting the state’s efforts to reduce maternal mortality and improve access for mothers and babies.

This momentum was a defining moment for Community Clinic as it solidified and catalyzed their mission of providing exceptional, accessible care right where people are.

Women’s health services are now offered at the Progress Avenue clinic, where expanded capacity has increased appointment availability and improved continuity of care for patients.

“We’ve always believed we’re not just in the community—we’re part of it,” said Community Clinic CEO Judd Semingson. “Responding to real needs is central to who we are, and we’re proud to see the real impact this expansion is having for women and families in Siloam Springs.”

Expanding Care for Mothers and Families

The expansion comes at a critical time for the region, following the loss of local labor and delivery services, which has created additional challenges for pregnant women and families.

In response, Community Clinic launched a hospital-based midwifery program last year in partnership with Willow Creek Women's Hospital and Northwest Health. Established following state maternal health legislation, the program expands care options while helping patients avoid unnecessary travel for prenatal visits.

"For patients—especially later in pregnancy—frequent travel for appointments can become a real burden," said Emily Goucher, Director of Women's Health at Community Clinic. "This model allows us to provide prenatal and postpartum care locally, while coordinating safe deliveries in a hospital setting."

The program celebrated the delivery of its first hospital-based newborn last December, reflecting both the immediate impact and long-term potential of expanded maternal healthcare access in Northwest Arkansas.

Together, the expanded women's health services and midwifery program represent Community Clinic's continued commitment to exceptional whole-person care, improving outcomes for women at every stage of life.
